Dear Ms Murdock:

This is in response to your letter of January 4, 2006 concerning the proposed utility line crossing of Laurel Fork and two tributaries to Laurel Fork.

If the proposed project requires the discharge of dredged or fill material below the ordinary high water line of Laurel Fork Creek or its tributaries, and/or into adjacent wetlands, a Department of the Army Permit will be necessary. If required, the Corps of Engineers is obligated to comply with the requirements of the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA), the Endangered Species Act (ESA), and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). The Corps cannot issue a permit until the requirements of these laws have been satisfied.

Depending upon the proposed impacts, a Nationwide Permit 12 may be applicable. However, we have made a preliminary database search and determined that there may be potential impacts of this project on the state and federally listed endangered Northern Flying Squirrel, Glaucomys sabrinus fuscus. As indicated above, we would be required to contact and coordinate with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service for their input on this proposed project.

In: addition, we have received information from the Virginia Department of Historic Resources that portions of this project

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may impact a listed historic property requiring additional coordination with that agency.

Further, Laurel Fork is a listed State Trout Water (see attachment), including it's perennial tributaries, and pursuant to a regional condition to this nationwide permit, prior coordination with the Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries will also be required before a DA permit is issued. As part of this review, it will be relevant to clarify the perennial or intermittent classification of the two tributaries which may be impacted by this project.
